

Rhode Island documents its activities and accomplishments of the EMS for children program by using the set of performance measures set by the National EMS program. These measures help monitor program progress, identify potential areas for improvement and examine the degree to which each has been fulfilled. The current set of performance measures, and the level of progress by the State of Rhode Island are as follows:

Performance Measure 71	The percent of pre-hospital provider agencies in the state/territory that have online pediatric medical direction available from dispatch through patient transport to a definitive care facility.  Rhode Island = 100%
Performance Measure 72	The percent of pre-hospital provider agencies in the state/territory that have offline pediatric medical direction available from dispatch through patient transport to a definitive care facility.
