CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Emergency Medical Services (hereafter "Department"), upon information filed by **Brian J. Davis** (hereafter "Respondent"). Specifically, information filed by Respondent indicated that on various dates ranging from 1996 through 2010, Respondent pleaded *Nolo Contendere* on numerous occasions to the crime of Disorderly Conduct (7 counts); Simple Assault (5 counts) Domestic Vandalism (1 count) and Malicious Injury to Property (1 count), which resulting in periods of probation and suspended sentences. Accordingly, it is agreed as follows:

1. That Respondent's Emergency Medical Technician license is hereby placed on probation for a period of thirty-six (36) months.
2. That said probationary period shall commence upon Respondent's employment and/or performing services as an Emergency Medical Technician with a licensed emergency medical service and will abate for the duration of any period in which Respondent ceases to be employed and/or performs volunteer services as an Emergency Medical Technician.
3. That during the period of probation, the Respondent will notify the Department of any criminal charge or violation immediately.
4. That during the probationary period should the Respondent fail to comply with the provisions of Chapter 23.4,1 and or the *Rules and Regulation Relating to Emergency Medical Services* or any other terms of this consent

order the Department shall suspend Respondent's Emergency Medical Technician license.

5. That during the period of probation, Respondent's employers, including the Chief of a licensed Ambulance Service for which he is employed and/or serves as a volunteer shall submit to the Department reports every six (6) months relating to the Respondent's performance and conduct. It shall be the responsibility of Respondent to have his employers submits said reports.
6. That during the period of probation, should the Respondent's employment and/or volunteer serve change, he shall notify the Department forthwith of said change including the name and address of new employer and the reason for employment change.
7. That a copy of this Consent Order shall be forwarded by the Department of the Respondent's current employer(s) and/or volunteer service and future employers and/or volunteer services while this consent order is in effect.
8. That this Consent Order shall obviate the necessity of a hearing on the matters forming the basis for this Consent Order.
9. That at the expiration of the thirty-six (36) month period of probation, Respondent may apply to the Department for a termination of the probation.
10. That this consent order is a public document and is posted on the Department's licensing web site.
