SUMMARY SUSPENSION

On June 8, 2011, the Rhode Island Department of Health became aware of information that on June 7, 2011 you were arraigned on a felony count of larceny of a controlled substance.

Accordingly, you have been deemed in violation of the *Rules and Regulation Relating to Emergency Medical Services [R23-4.1-EMS]*, specifically the following sections:


- Section 4.0 Qualifications of Emergency Medical Technicians. "4.1.3 have demonstrated to the satisfaction of the Director that he/she is of good moral character."

Furthermore, per Section 14.0 Revocation of License, the cause for the suspension of the license is:

- Has violated any federal, state or local law.
- Is guilty of unprofessional conduct which includes failure to adhere to all the provisions herein, including failure to adhere to the current guidelines and protocols referred to in these regulations and/pr failure to maintain standards of EMT practice.
- Has failed to comply with the statutory and regulatory provisions herein.

ORDER

After review of the information received, it has been determined that Greg A. St. Jean has violated the *Rules and Regulation Relating to Emergency Medical Services [R23-4.1-EMS]*. Accordingly, Greg A. St. Jean is suspended from practicing as an Emergency Medical Technician until further Order of the Rhode Island Department of Health. Respondent's suspension is in accordance with the terms of the Administrative Procedures Act, RIGL 42-3514(c). Respondent is entitled to a hearing pursuant to the provisions of RIGL 42-35-14(c).
