Dear Ms. Ogley,

This is to inform you that the Director of Health suspended your license as an Emergency Medical Technician effective August 18, 1995.


By letter dated July 28, 1995 you were informed that the Director of Health would suspend your license as an Emergency Medical Technician if you did not request a hearing by August 18, 1995. You did not request the hearing. Accordingly, the Director reviewed this matter and acted to suspend your license.

The Director has good and sufficient cause for this action inasmuch as you did, on April 17, 1995, plead nolo contendere to charges of assault with a dangerous weapon and the disposition of the matter resulted in a suspended sentence, five (5) year period of probation, counseling and payment of fines. This activity constitutes grounds to suspend an Emergency Medical Technician license under the provisions of R.I.G.L. (1987 Reenactment) Section 23-4.1-9 and Section 15.0 of the Regulations Relating to Emergency Medical Services.

In conclusion, this letter will constitute official notification that your license as an Emergency Medical Technician in the state of Rhode Island is suspended effective August 18, 1995. This letter will be placed in your permanent record maintained by the Department of Health, Division of Emergency Medical Services.
