

**CONSENT ORDER**

Pursuant to Section 5-34-24 the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, 2008 Reenactment, a complaint was filed with the Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education (hereinafter referred to as "Board") charging Michelle Roderick, LPN, Respondent with a violation of Chapter 5-34 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, 2008 Reenactment. After consideration by the Investigating Committee of the Board, it was agreed by and between the parties:

1. Respondent is a practical nurse licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island.
2. That at all pertinent times Respondent was employed at Berkshine Place in Providence in Rhode Island.
3. That Respondent failed to remove an Exelon Patch that had previously been placed on a patient prior to administering another patch.
4. That the conduct described in paragraph three (3) herein constitutes unprofessional conduct as defined in Section 5-34-24 (6) and the Rules and Regulations promulgated there under.


**The parties agree as follows:**

- (a) Respondent is a nurse licensed and doing business under and by virtue of the Laws of the State of Rhode Island, practical nurse license number, LPN07382;

- (b) Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Board;
- (c) Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands that it is a proposal of an Investigating Committee of the Board and is subject to the final approval of the Board. This Consent Order is not binding on Respondent until final ratification by the Board.
- (d) Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
- (1) The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
  - (2) The right to produce witnesses and evidence in his behalf at a hearing;
  - (3) The right to cross-examine witnesses;
  - (4) The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
  - (5) The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
  - (6) Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order;
  - (7) Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review;
  - (8) Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the Board to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to review adequately this Consent Order;
  - (9) Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the Respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Consent Order. The signing of this Consent Order is for settlement purposes only.

5. This Consent Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties and accepted by the Board.
6. Acceptance by the Respondent and approval by the Board of this Consent Order constitutes an admission of the facts contained herein.
7. That the Respondent voluntarily agrees to accept the sanction of a Reprimand.
8. That should Respondent fail to comply with the laws and regulations governing the practice of nursing and/or fail to comply with the terms of this Consent Order, her license as a practical nurse shall be subjected to suspension or other appropriate disciplinary action.
