Reinstatement Order

Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws §5-37-5.2, 1956, as amended, (2002 Reenactment) information was received by the Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline [Board] regarding Jibrán Khan MD (“Respondent”) from a pharmacist detailing the Respondent having presented prescriptions using a fictitious name. In turn the Board alerted the United States Food and Drug Administration Office of Criminal Investigation, RI Task Force. Respondent subsequently admitted to writing fraudulent prescriptions for fentanyl patches using two separate pharmacies and two different names. Respondent also admitted to taking narcotic medications from certain patients for personal use. Respondent was subsequently charged by both the Woonsocket and Lincoln police departments for charges related to possession of controlled substances and prescription writing in violation of the Food Drugs and Cosmetic Act and the Uniformed Controlled Substances Act. Respondent voluntarily surrendered his license to practice medicine on August 15, 2008.

The following are findings of fact and conclusions of law:

FINDINGS OF FACTS AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Respondent is a 1982 graduate of the King Edward medical college of Pakistan. He was born in 1957. He has been licensed to practice medicine in the State of RI since 1997. He is board certified in Internal Medicine and practices at his primary practice Ocean Medical Practice suite number 208, 20 Cumberland Hill Road in Woonsocket Rhode Island.
2. Respondent voluntarily surrendered his license to practice medicine on August 15, 2008 for having violated the provisions of of § 5-37-5.1 for unprofessional conduct for violating the provisions of state and Federal law relating to controlled substances.
3. Respondent subsequently underwent intensive residential treatment at the Farley Center in Williamsburg Virginia. He has since signed and complied with a 5 year substance abuse monitoring contract with the Physician's Health Committee.
4. Respondent failed to conform to the minimal standards of acceptable and prevailing medical practice in violation of § 5-37-5.1.

The parties agree as follows:


Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board.

- (1) Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:

- a. The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
 - b. The right to produce witnesses and evidence in his behalf at a hearing;
 - c. The right to cross examine witnesses;
 - d. The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
 - e. The right to further procedural steps except for specifically contained herein;
 - f. Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order;
 - g. Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review;
 - h. Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the Board to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to review adequately this Consent Order;
 - i. Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the Respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Consent Order.
- (2) Acceptance of this Consent Order constitutes an admission by the Respondent of the findings of fact made by the Board.
 - (3) This Consent Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties.
 - (4) Failure to fully comply with this Consent Order, when signed and accepted, shall subject the Respondent to further disciplinary action.

- (5) Respondent agrees to fully abide by the terms of his treatment and monitoring contract with the physician's health committee.
- (6) Respondent agrees not to prescribe any controlled substances nor to apply for a DEA registration without prior consent of the board.
- (7) Respondent agrees to limit his clinical hours to those recommended by the physician's health committee.
- (8) Respondent agrees to perform 50 hours of community service in a fashion approved by the board for each of the next 5 years to commence no later than 6-months after ratification of this order.
- (9) Respondent is reinstated on probation with a restriction that prohibits any prescription of controlled substances.
