ORDER

Issuance of Limited License with Probation

The Board of Medical Licensure and Discipline hereby issues a limited license to practice medicine in the State of Rhode Island under the term(s) that the licensee shall be on probation commencing on the date of issuance. The licensee shall contract with the Physician's Health Committee for the duration of his post-graduate training program and comply with all requirements imposed by this agreement. Failure to adhere to the terms of the PHC contract or to meet the academic and professional standards of the post-graduate training program shall be cause for revocation of this license during or after the probationary period. The licensee shall be entitled to request that the probationary period end after one year of the date of issuance. Probation may be lifted by the Board upon a showing of good standing in licensee's post-graduate training program and support of the PHC.

The parties agree as follows:

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Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Board.

- (1) Respondent has read this Order and understands that it is a proposal of an Licensing Committee of the Board and is subject to the final approval of the Board. This Consent Order is not binding on Respondent until final ratification by the Board.

- (2) Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
- a. The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
 - b. The right to produce witnesses and evidence in his behalf at a hearing;
 - c. The right to cross examine witnesses;
 - d. The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
 - e. The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
 - f. Any and all rights of appeal of this Order;
 - g. Any objection to the fact that this Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review;
 - h. Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the Board to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to review adequately this Order;
 - i. Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the Respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Order.
- (3) Acceptance of this Order constitutes an admission by the Respondent of the facts set forth herein.
- (4) This Consent Order shall become part of the public record once it is accepted the by Board.

(5) Failure to comply with the terms of this Order, when signed and accepted, may subject the Respondent to disciplinary action.
