

### CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to 23-17.9 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated there under, the Rhode Island Department of Health (hereinafter the "Department"), and the Nursing Assistant Advisory Board (hereinafter the "Board"), has investigated a complaint charging ADAMA FALL, NA37784 (hereinafter the "Respondent") with a violation of 23-17.9.

After review and consideration by the Department and the Board with respect to the allegations of unprofessional conduct of the Respondent, the following are and shall constitute

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a Nursing Assistant licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island under Nursing Assistant License Number, NA37784.
2. At all times relevant hereto, Respondent was employed by The Highlands on the East Side.
3. The Department has alleged that on or about October 14, 2015, Respondent did not act in the best interest of a patient by refusing to get assistance for a patient found on the floor.
4. That the foregoing allegations of the Department, described in paragraph three (3) herein, if proven, constitute unprofessional conduct pursuant to 23-17.9 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated there under.
5. That the Department and the Respondent mutually agree to enter into this consent order in the matter of C15-1040 to resolve this complaint to avoid a contested hearing.
6. That the Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Department and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Department.


7. That the Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands this Consent Order shall become binding once signed by the Respondent and the Department and/or Board.
8. That the Respondent understands the purpose of this Consent Order is solely to resolve the complaint of unprofessional conduct alleged against the Respondent.
9. That the Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
  - a. The right to have an Administrative Hearing on this matter;
  - b. The right to represent himself/herself or be represented by an Attorney of Respondent's own choosing at said hearing;
  - c. The right to present testimony, evidence and witnesses on Respondent's behalf;
  - d. The right to cross-examine witnesses presented by the Department;
  - e. The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
  - f. The right to take an appeal from the terms of this Consent Order.

ACCORDINGLY AND BASED ON THE FOREGOING

The Rhode Island Department of Health and the Respondent hereby agree to the following disposition of this complaint:

1. That Respondent is hereby issued the sanction of a Reprimand.
2. That this Order shall become part of a public record of this proceeding.
