

### CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Department of Health, Office of Health Professions (hereinafter Department), upon allegations that Adewumi Adesina (hereinafter Respondent) did engage in conduct which could constitute grounds for disciplinary action while he was employed as a nursing assistant at Cedar Crest Nursing Home. This conduct is alleged to have occurred on during February 2000. Prior to initiating administrative action, it was agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. That this Consent Order is entered into without either party admitting or denying the allegations forming the basis for this Consent Order.
2. That Respondent shall serve a one (1) year period of probation commencing 07 September 2000. The Respondent will be employed as a nursing assistant during the probationary period and will forward to the Department copies of two performance evaluations, during the one (1) year period of probation, which review basic nursing care and respect for residents' rights.
3. Respondent will receive 12 hours of in-services in the areas of basic nursing care and respect for residents rights and will provide documentation of the hours and content to the Department.
4. That should respondent implement and comply with the documentation of inservice training and good performance evaluations during the 1 year probation, the Department will consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of probation.
5. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this agreement or the Rules and Regulations for Nursing Assistants, the Department will propose appropriate disciplinary action.
6. That this Consent Order constitutes a final disposition of the matters forming the basis for this Order and obviates the necessity for an Administrative Hearing with respect to matters contained in the complaint C00-073.
