CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Section 23-17.9, of the Rules and Regulations for the Registration of Nursing assistants... of the State of Rhode Island, a complaint was filed with the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereinafter referred to as " Department") charging Beatrice Gabriel NA, Respondent, with violation of Chapter 23-17 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, 1956, as Amended.

After consideration by the Department, the following constitutes the Findings of Fact with respect to the professional performance of the Respondent:

1. Respondent is a registered nursing assistant licensed to practice nurse assisting in the State of Rhode Island.

2. That all pertinent times herein Respondent was employed as a Nursing Assistant.

3. That during 1992, 93 and 1994 Respondent did admit to filing applications with a social security number which belonged to another. The parties

agree as follows:

1. Respondent is a registered nursing assistant licensed and doing business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Rhode Island
2. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Department and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Department.
3. Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands that it is a proposal of the Department and is not binding on Respondent until signed by the Respondent and the Department.
- 4). Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
 - a) The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
 - b) Any and all rights of appeal of the Consent Order;
5. This Consent Order shall become part of the public records of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties. It shall be published as the Department, in its discretion, deems appropriate.
6. Failure to comply with this Consent Order, once signed and accepted, shall subject the Respondent to further disciplinary action.
7. Respondent voluntarily agrees to accept the sanction of a reprimand.
8. Respondent voluntarily agrees to at least a one (1) year period of probation to commence on 7 April 2000 and

will abate for the duration of any period in which Respondent ceases to be employed as a Nursing assistant.

9. That, during the period of probation, Respondent's employer(s) shall submit to the Board reports every three (3) months relating to Respondent's conduct and performance. That it shall be the responsibility of Respondent to have her employer(s) submit said reports.

10. During the period of probation the Respondent shall notify the Department forthwith of any changes in her employment including the name and address of the new employer(s) and the reason for said change in employment.

11. That should Respondent comply with the laws and regulations governing the practice of nurse assisting during the one (1) year period of probation and comply with the requirements of this Order, she may apply to the Board for an unrestricted registration to practice nurse assisting.

12. That should Respondent fail to comply with the laws and regulations governing the practice of nurse assisting and/or fail to comply with the terms of this Order, her license as a nursing assistant shall be subject to suspension or other appropriate disciplinary action.
