**ORDER**

Pursuant to R.I.G.L. (2001 Reenactment) Section 23-17.9-8 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, the Rhode Island Department of Health (hereinafter "Department"), after review and consultation, has investigated a complaint charging Christine M. Floyd (NA22942) (hereinafter "Respondent") with a violation of Section 23-17.9-8 of the General Laws.


After consideration by the Department, the following constitutes the Findings of Fact with respect to the professional performance of the Respondent:

1. Respondent is a Nursing Assistant licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island.
2. That all pertinent times, Respondent was employed by Rhode Island Hospital, Providence, RI.
3. That is, on or about August 30, 2010, Respondent failed to accurately report employment history by forging Respondent's employer's signature on Respondent's 2010 Nursing Assistant Renewal Form. On January 13, 2011, the HR Support Services from Rhode Island Hospital confirmed Respondent was employed as a Unit Secretary, not as a Nursing Assistant and obtained fraudulent attestation of signature and authorization.
4. That the conduct described in paragraph three (3) herein constitutes unprofessional conduct pursuant to Section 23-17.9-8 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder.

Based on the foregoing, the Rhode Island Department of Health hereby enters the following:

1. Nursing Assistant license issued to the Respondent is hereby suspended for a period of three (3) years commencing March 31, 2011.
2. At the time Respondent seeks reinstatement of the Nursing Assistant license, Respondent shall submit documentation evidencing that Respondent is capable and competent to engage in the practice of a Nursing Assistant. In addition, Respondent must meet all educational requirements for licensure in effect at the time Respondent applies for licensure.
3. That should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this Order, Respondent shall be subject to further disciplinary sanctions.
4. That this Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding.
