CONSENT AGREEMENT

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereinafter Department), upon matters contained in complaint (1-0499) filed with the Department alleging that ELVIRA ALONZO (hereinafter the Respondent) deliberately continued employment as a Nursing assistant Trainee for a period in excess of the 120 days allowable for all or part of the period 3/97 to 3/99. Based on the foregoing, the Department proposed a reprimand and placing the Respondent on probation for a one (1) year period subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The Respondent will be subject to a reprimand followed by a one (1) year period of probation commencing on ^{24pm} 7/7/99.
2. The Respondent will document remedial training in the areas of ethical responsibilities of the nursing assistant and the rules and regulations relating to nursing assistants.
3. The Respondent will be employed as a Nursing assistant during the probationary period and will forward copies of

at least two (2) performance evaluations by her employer(s) and her responsibilities as a Nursing Assistant, which review basic nursing care, ethical responsibilities and recommend continued employment.

4. That the period of probation will cease during any period when Respondent is not employed as a nursing assistant. Respondent will document one year of employment and will notify the Department of Health of any change in employment.

5. That should Respondent implement and comply with the documentation of remedial training, employment as a nursing assistant and good to excellent performance evaluations and recommendations as a Nursing Assistant during the one (1) year period of probation, the Department will consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of this probation. Respondent will request reinstatement of registration in good standing.

6. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this Agreement, her Registration as a Nursing Assistant will be subject to automatic suspension. If Respondent is not employed as a Nursing Assistant during all or part of the one (1) year probationary period, she may apply for an extension in writing.

7. That the terms of this Consent Agreement shall obviate the necessity for the initiation of a formal administrative hearing before the Adjudication Officer of the Rhode Island Department of Health with respect to the

matters contained in the complaint (1-0499) filed against
the Respondent.
