CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereafter department), upon allegations of patient abuse. In resolution of this matter, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. This Consent Order is entered into without Ms. Beauregard [Respondent] admitting or the Department of Health [Department] denying the allegations that form the basis for this Consent Order.
2. Respondent shall serve a one (1) year period of probation commencing October 31, 2000.
3. Respondent shall be employed as a Nursing Assistant during the one (1) year probationary period, which shall abate for any period when she is not employed as a Nursing Assistant. If Respondent is not employed as a Nursing Assistant during all or part of the one (1) year probationary period, she may ask for an extension, in writing.
4. Respondent shall attend and document twelve (12) hours of in-service in the areas of resident abuse and neglect and professional conduct as provided by the Rehabilitation Hospital of Rhode Island.
5. Respondent shall provide copies of quarterly performance evaluations from her employer during her probation that indicate that her performance meets standards.
6. Respondent shall work under direct supervision, not in home care or where there is indirect nursing supervision.
7. Should Respondent comply with the requirements set forth in paragraphs 4 and 5 above during the one (1) year probation, the Department shall consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of probation.

8. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this Consent Order or the Rules and Regulations for Nursing Assistants, Respondent may be subject to disciplinary action subject to the policies, procedures, rules and regulations related to disciplinary actions.

9. This Consent Order constitutes a full and final resolution of this matter and obviates the need for an Administrative Hearing with respect to matters contained in complaint C00-111.
