




Respondent's employment and/or performing services as a Nursing assistant and will abate for the duration of any period in which Respondent ceases to be employed and/or performs as a Nursing Assistant.

3. That during the period of probation Respondent shall notify the Department forthwith in the event that he is charged with any crime by any law enforcement agency in any jurisdiction. The Department reserves the right to take appropriate licensure action should Respondent be charged with a crime in any jurisdiction.
4. That during the period of probation should Respondent fail to comply with the provisions of Chapter 23-17.9 and/or the "Rules and regulations for the Registration of Nursing Assistants.... ", or any of the terms of this Consent Agreement, or the terms of the Texas probation, the Department shall initiate appropriate action with respect to Respondent's licensure status.
5. That during the period of probation, Respondent shall submit to the Department one report from the employer relating to Respondent's conduct and performance. That it shall be the responsibility of Respondent to submit said report. Further, the Respondent will provide the Department with the probation discharge order from Texas.
6. That during the period of probation should respondent change employment, he shall notify the Department  
and address

of the new employers. and the reason for the change in employment.

7. That a copy of this Consent Agreement shall be forwarded by the Department to Respondent's current employer(s) and all future employer(s) during the period of probation.
8. That this Consent Agreement shall obviate the necessity for a hearing on the matters forming the basis for this Consent Agreement.
9. That at the expiration of the one (1) year period of probation, or upon receipt by the Department of the probation discharge order from Texas as well as a performance evaluation from the Respondent's employer recommending continued employment, Respondent may apply to the Department for an unrestricted license as a Nursing Assistant.
