CONSENT ORDER

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereinafter Department), upon allegations that Queenie Thompson (hereinafter Respondent) did engage in conduct which could constitute grounds for disciplinary action while she was employed as a nursing assistant at Hopkins manor of Rhode Island. This conduct is alleged to have occurred prior to late May 1999. Prior to initiating administrative action on this matter, it was agreed by and between the parties as follows:

1. That this Consent Order is entered into without either party admitting or denying the allegations forming the basis for this Consent Order.
 2. That Respondent shall serve a six (6) month period of probation commencing 10/30/00.
 3. The Respondent will be employed as a nursing assistant during the six (6) month probationary period, which will abate for any period when she is not employed as a Nursing Assistant. If Respondent is not employed as a Nursing Assistant during all or part of the six (6) month probationary period, she may ask for an extension, in writing.
 4. Respondent will document six (6) hours of in-service in the areas of resident abuse and neglect and professional conduct.
 5. Respondent will provide copies of quarterly performance evaluations from her Nursing Assistant employer, during her probation, which recommend continued employment.
 6. Respondent will work under direct supervision
 7. That should respondent implement and comply with the documentation of remedial training and good performance evaluations from her nursing supervisor during the six (6) month probation, the Department will consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of probation.
5. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this agreement or the Rules and Regulations for Nursing Assistants, her registration will be subject to further disciplinary action

6. That this Consent Order constitutes a final disposition of the matters forming the basis for this Order and obviates the necessity for an Administrative Hearing. With respect to matters contained in the complaint C00-112.
