CONSENT AGREEMENT

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereinafter Department), upon matters contained in complaints (4-0797 a,b) filed with the Department alleging that Samuel Miller (hereinafter the Respondent) willfully acted in a manner inconsistent with the health and safety of residents during April 1997 while employed as a Nursing Assistant by Coventry Health Center. Based upon the foregoing, the Department proposed placing the Respondent on probation subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The Respondent will be subject to a one (1) year period of probation commencing on October 22 1997.
2. The Respondent will document remedial training in the areas of patient/resident rights, basic nursing care and ethical responsibilities of the Nursing Assistant to total at least six (6) hours.
3. The Respondent will be employed as a Nursing assistant during the probationary period and also forward copies of at least two (2) performance evaluations by his employer, in his responsibilities as a Nursing Assistant,

which review his basic nursing care, respect for residents rights and recommend continued employment.

4. That should Respondent implement and comply with the documentation of remedial training and satisfactory performance evaluations as a Nursing Assistant during the one (1) year period of probation, the Department will consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of this probation. Respondent will provide the Department with proof of completion of the required remedial training prior to 22 October 1998 and request reinstatement of registration in good standing.

4. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this Agreement, his Registration as a Nursing Assistant will be subject to suspension. If Respondent is not employed as a Nursing Assistant during all or part of the one (1) year probationary period, he may apply for an extension.

5. That the terms of this Consent Agreement shall obviate the necessity for the initiation of a formal administrative hearing before the Adjudication Officer of the Rhode Island department of Health with respect to the matters contained in the complaints (4-0797 a,b) filed against the Respondent.
