### CONSENT AGREEMENT

This matter is before the Department of Health, Division of Professional Regulation (hereinafter Department), upon matters contained in complaint (C00-010) filed with the Department alleging that Yemi Akinola (hereinafter the Respondent) abused a resident of Hillside Health Care nursing Home on or about 10/23/00. Prior to initiating administrative action to revoke or suspend the Respondent's nursing Assistant registration/license, it was agreed to by and between the parties as follows:

1. The Respondent will be subject to a one (1) year period of probation commencing on 5/24/00.
2. The Respondent will document remedial training in the areas of the patient rights and communication skills as part of the 12 hours of in-service required per year.
3. The Respondent will be employed as a Nursing assistant during the probationary period and will forward copies of at least two (2) performance evaluations by his employer, in her responsibilities as a Nursing Assistant, which review basic nursing care, respect for residents rights, patient/resident safety and recommend continued employment.
4. That should Respondent implement and comply with the documentation of remedial training and good to excellent performance evaluations and recommendations as a Nursing Assistant during the one (1) year period of probation, the Department will consider Respondent to have fulfilled the conditions of this probation. Respondent will provide the Department with proof of completion of the required remedial training prior to 5/24/2001 and request reinstatement of registration in good standing.
5. Should Respondent fail to comply with the terms of this Agreement, or the Rules and Regulations for Nursing Assistants, her Registration as a Nursing Assistant will be subject to automatic suspension. If Respondent is not employed as a Nursing Assistant during all or part of the one (1) year probationary period, she may apply for an extension in writing.
6. That the terms of this Consent Agreement shall obviate the necessity for the initiation of a formal administrative hearing before the Adjudication Officer of the

Rhode Island Department of Health with respect to the matters contained in the complaint (C00-010) filed against the Respondent.
