### CONSENT ORDER

Nicole Delmonico (hereinafter "Respondent") surrendered her license as a physician assistant in Rhode Island November, 24, 2010. The Board of Licensure of Physician Assistants (hereinafter the "Board") makes the following:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent is a physician assistant who was issued a license as a Physician Assistant November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2010.
2. Respondent entered into an agreement with the Massachusetts Board of Registration of Physician Assistants on November 19<sup>th</sup>, 2010.
3. Respondent subsequently surrendered her Rhode Island physician assistant license on November 24<sup>th</sup>, 2010.
4. Respondent had her physician assistant license reinstated in Massachusetts and was on probation. Respondent was subsequently granted an unrestricted license May 18<sup>th</sup>, 2016 after completing a 5 year program with the Massachusetts Professional Recovery System (MPRS) program. Respondent has been discharged from the MPRS program and is considered unrestricted.

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5. The Board through reciprocity acknowledges the actions of the Massachusetts Board of Registration of Physician assistants and imposes the same conditions.

**Based on the foregoing, the parties agree as follows:**

1. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board.
2. Respondent has agreed to this Consent Order and understands that it is subject to final approval of the Board.
3. Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
  - a. The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
  - b. The right to produce witnesses and evidence on his behalf at a hearing;
  - c. The right to cross examine witnesses;
  - d. The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
  - e. The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
  - f. Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order; and
  - g. Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review.
  - h. Any objection that this Consent Order will be reported to the National Practitioner Data Bank, Federation of State Medical Boards as well as posted on the department's public web site.
4. Respondent is eligible for reinstatement, without restriction of her Rhode Island Physician Assistant license should she so choose to do so.
