CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Section 5-34-24 and 5-34.2-4 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, As Amended, and the Rules and Regulations promulgated thereunder, the Rhode Island Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education (hereinafter "Board"), has investigated a complaint charging Lisa Marenaro, PCNS, (hereinafter "Respondent"), with a violation of Chapter 5-34 and 5-34.2 of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, As Amended.

The following constitutes the Findings of Fact with respect to the professional performance of the Respondent:

1. Respondent is a Registered Nurse licensed to practice nursing in the State of Rhode Island.
2. Respondent is a Psychiatric and Mental Health Clinical Nurse Specialist licensed to practice in the State of Rhode Island with prescriptive authority.
3. Respondent failed to show proof that she was in a collaborative practice agreement with a licensed physician from March 19, 2012 through April 2, 2012.
4. Respondent prescribed medications classified as stimulants in doses exceeding the acceptable standards of practice.

5. Respondent failed to maintain standards of effective controls to prevent diversion, and failed to appropriately chart and monitor patients under her care.

Pursuant to Section 5-34-24, this constitutes unprofessional conduct in the State of Rhode Island and, as such, is grounds to discipline her license.

The parties agree as follows:

1. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Board.
2. Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands that it is a proposal and is subject to final ratification by the Board. This Consent Order is not binding on Respondent until final ratification by the Board.
3. As a result of this conduct, the Respondent agrees to surrender her license as a Psychiatric Clinical Nurse Specialist (License No. PPNS00019), her RI controlled substances Registration (No. CPPNS00019) and her DEA Registration (No. MM0582812). The parties agree that no action has been taken in this case against her RN license (No. RN32695) and that she is not surrendering that license.
4. Respondent agrees not to reapply to the Board for a new Psychiatric Clinical Nurse Specialist license for a period of at least two years from the date of ratification of this Order.
5. Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:
 - a) The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
 - b) The right to produce witnesses and evidence in her behalf at a hearing;
 - c) The right to cross-examine witnesses;
 - d) The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;

- e) The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
 - f) Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order.
 - g) Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review;
 - h) Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the Board to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to review adequately this Consent Order;
 - i) Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the Respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Consent Order. The signing of this Consent Order is for settlement purposes only.
6. This Consent Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties and accepted by the Board.
7. Respondent neither admits nor denies the allegations set forth herein.


