CONSENT ORDER

Pursuant to Section 5-34-24 the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, 2008 Reenactment, a complaint was filed with the Board of Nurse Registration and Nursing Education (hereinafter referred to as "Board") charging Shaun Cooper, RN, Respondent with a violation of Chapter 5-34-24 (6) of the General Laws of the State of Rhode Island, 2008 Reenactment. After consideration by the Investigating Committee of the Board, it was agreed by and between the parties:

1. Respondent is a registered nurse, license number RN36143 and able to conduct business under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Rhode Island
2. Respondent admits to the jurisdiction of the Board and hereby agrees to remain under the jurisdiction of the Board.
3. Respondent failed to maintain appropriate professional nursing boundaries while caring for a patient at Newport County Community Mental Health Center from October through December of 2011.
4. That Respondent has read this Consent Order and understands that it is a proposal of the Board and is subject to final ratification by the Board. This Consent Order and the contents thereof are not binding on Respondent until final ratification by the Board.
5. Respondent hereby acknowledges and waives:

- a) The right to appear personally or by counsel or both before the Board;
- b) The right to produce witnesses and evidence in his behalf at a hearing;
- c) The right to cross-examine witnesses;
- d) The right to have subpoenas issued by the Board;
- e) The right to further procedural steps except for those specifically contained herein;
- f) Any and all rights of appeal of this Consent Order;
- g) Any objection to the fact that this Consent Order will be presented to the Board for consideration and review;
- h) Any objection to the fact that it will be necessary for the board to become acquainted with all evidence pertaining to this matter in order to adequately review this Consent Order;
- i) Any objection to the fact that the Board reviewing this Consent Order may be the same as the Hearing Committee presiding over this matter should it later be brought to an administrative proceeding;
- j) Any objection to the fact that potential bias against the respondent may occur as a result of the presentation of this Consent Order. The signing of this Consent Order is for settlement purposes only.

6. This Consent Order shall become part of the public record of this proceeding once it is accepted by all parties and accepted by the Board and Respondent's license shall reflect that the status is probationary.

7. Acceptance by the Respondent and approval by the Board of this Consent Order constitutes an admission of the facts contained herein.

8. Failure to comply with the Consent Order, once signed and accepted, shall subject the Respondent to further disciplinary action.
9. That the Respondent shall serve at least a two (2) year probation subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this order.
10. That said probationary period shall commence upon the date of the execution of this Consent Order by all the parties and will abate for the duration of any period in which Respondent ceases to be employed as a nurse. Upon employment as a registered nurse Respondent shall notify the Board as to the name and address of the employer and the date employment commenced.
11. That, during the period of probation, Respondent shall provide a copy of this Consent Order to all current and future employers. The Respondent shall submit to the Board evaluations from the employer at three (3) month intervals relating to Respondent's conduct and performance; that it shall be the responsibility of Respondent to have the employer submit said reports.
12. That during the period of probation Respondent shall notify the Board forthwith of any changes in employment, including the name and address of the new employer(s) and the reason for said change.
13. That during the period of probation, Respondent shall not work in a staffing agency and/or pool or in a home health environment. That Respondent shall work under the supervision of a registered nurse or physician and shall never work alone, not work nights the 11-7 shift and not work more than 40 hours per work.
14. That the Respondent will continue in mental health treatment with Linda McBride, PCNS at the Veterans Administration and submit to the Board progress evaluations from the aforementioned provider at three (3) month intervals.

15. That, during the period of probation, Respondent shall not work with any psychiatric patients.
16. That the Respondent shall present evidence of enrollment and satisfactory completion of a continuing education course "Respecting Professional Boundaries" within the next 6 months. This course can be found at the URL www.ncsbn.org. Once you are on the NCSBN home page scroll to the bottom of the page where you will see 13 icons. Click on ncsbn learning extension (2nd row 4th icon from left to right). Then click on NURSES which will bring you to the course titles. Click on sign up and register for the course.
17. That should Respondent comply with the laws and regulations governing the practice of nursing during the period of probation and comply with the requirements of this Consent Order, Respondent may apply to the Board for an unrestricted license to practice as a registered nurse.
18. That should Respondent fail to comply with the laws and regulations governing the practice of nursing and/or fail to comply with the terms of this Order, the license as a registered nurse shall be subject to suspension or other appropriate disciplinary action.
