Car Seats in Clinics-providence Safe Communities Partnership (PSCP) works with the five neighborhood health clinics in Providence and with Women & Infants Hospital to identify families in financial need who have children in need of proper child safety seats. Injury Prevention Center (cont)					3. Buckle Up Faithfully-PSCP has partnered with more than ten African American churches to promote seat belt use among congregants. Pastors of minority churches are respected gatekeepers and thus play a pivotal role in the implementation and success of community health promotion programs. A variety of approaches have been used in the church to promote seat belt use. These components include: traffic related sermons, victim testimonials, traffic safety bulletin inserts and the Buckle up Faithfully Safety Celebration, an outdoor safety event featuring the Blessing of Buckled Drivers and Passengers. PSCP, the RI Department of Transportation's Office on Highway Safety, car crash victims and church pastors helped to spread the Buckle up message at this year's Safety Celebration held at the Olney St Baptist Church. Injury Prevention Center (cont)					4. Safety day-Providence Safe Communities Partnership's signature event is Safety Day, an outdoor neighborhood fair that aims to increase injury prevention awareness. Representatives from more than 30 state and local agencies and organizations set up interactive fire safety demonstrations, bicycle helmet fitting and distribution, child I.D. packet booth and a bike safety obstacle course. Children who complete the six mandatory safety stations are entered to win raffle prizes. Approximately 1,000 people attended last year's safety day. This year Safety Day was held in partnership with Sodexo School Services, Neighborhood Health Plan of RI & Providence School Department's Back to School Celebration.
