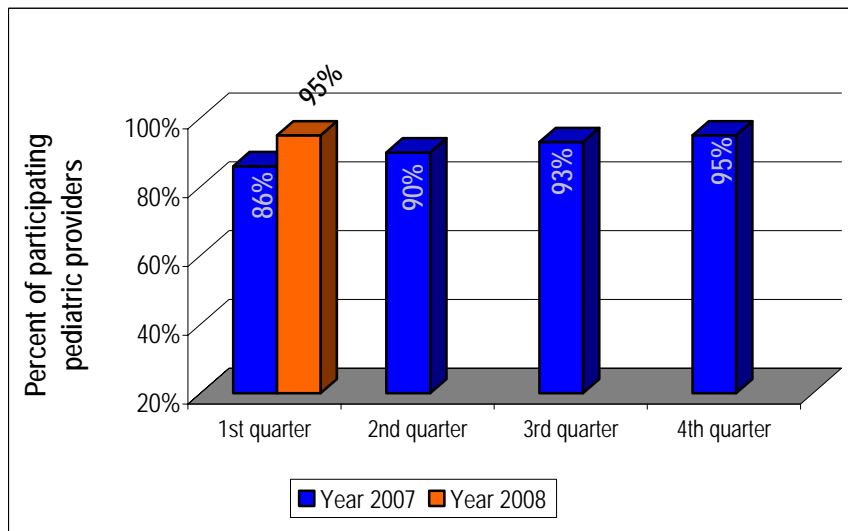

1) Goal: To increase pediatric provider participation in KIDSNET.

Objective: To increase the participation of pediatric practices in KIDSNET to 100% by the end of 2008.



There are 175 pediatric practices in R.I. who provide primary care to children under the age of 6. Of this population, 166 practices are participating. The remaining 9 practices have signed the KIDSNET User Agreement and will participate using EMR technology. (See attachment)

There are 26 Family Practitioner practices that primarily serve children born before 1997 who are not yet participating. (See attachment)

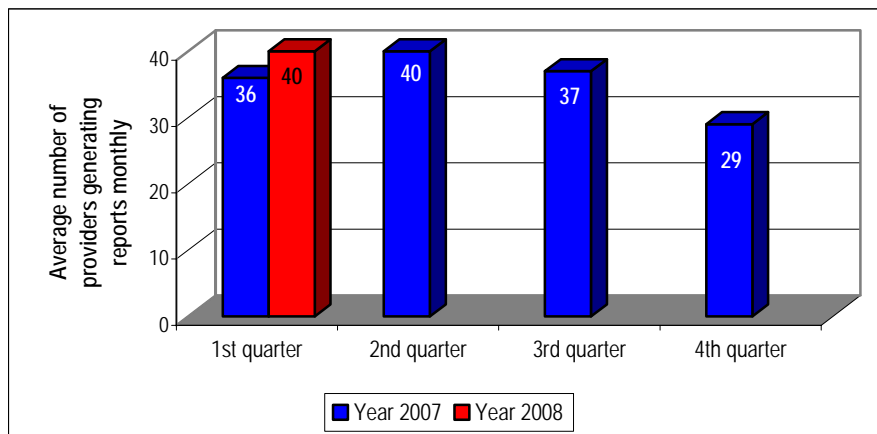
Gynecology practices have been offered SSV vaccines to administer age appropriate vaccinations to adolescents seen in the practices. To date, 5 practices are participating in KIDSNET.

2) Goal: To increase providers' average monthly usage of the on-demand KIDSNET exception reports.

Objective: To increase providers' average monthly usage of the on-demand Lead and Immunization reports to 55 practices by the end of 2008.



Forty (40) of the 166 practices ran monthly exception reports. Practices have been educated on the value of running monthly reports and are repeatedly given this message at site visits. The 2006 KIDSNET Data Book highlights the benefits derived from routinely running reports.

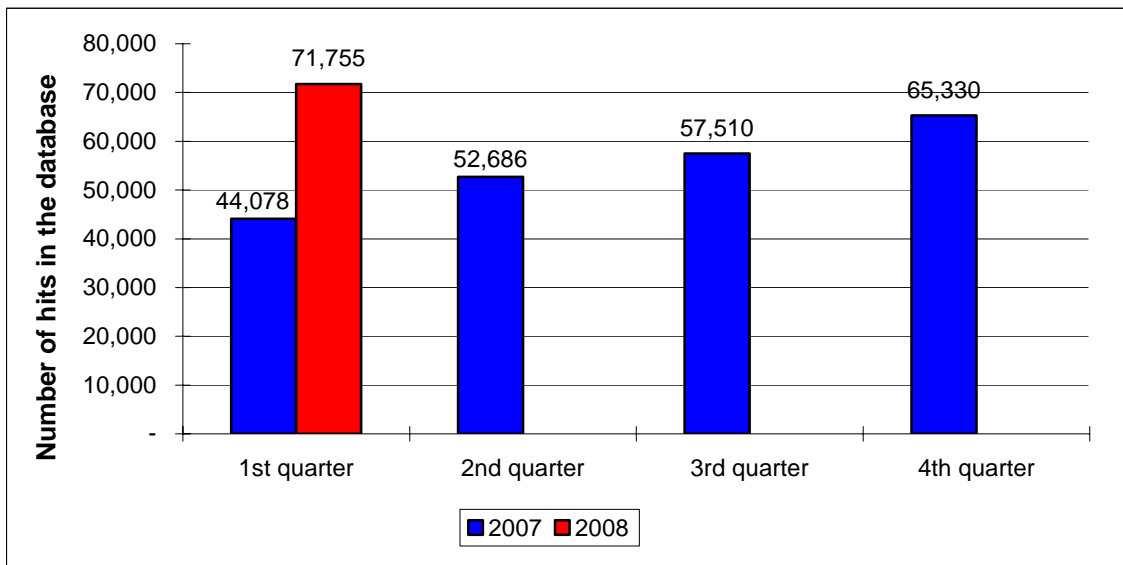
In recognition of Immunization Week, in April, practices were encouraged with an incentive to run missing immunization reports.

3) Goal: To increase providers' overall usage of the KIDSNET application.

Objective: To increase overall quarterly usage of the KIDSNET application to 75,000 hits per quarter by the end of 2008.



The numbers shown in the graph represent the number of “hits” or times providers have accessed screens in KIDSNET.

Significant increase in “hits” this quarter due to:

- New KIDSNET features introduced to sites
- KIDSNET trainings conducted at new provider sites
- KIDSNET training opportunities at existing provider sites due to face time in practices
- Increase in participating practices
