Purpose of this Meeting



- The Centurion Foundation, Inc. submitted a Hospital Conversion Act ("HCA") application on November 14, 2023, to purchase the CharterCARE hospital system, including Roger Williams Medical Center and Our Lady of Fatima Hospital.
- The Rhode Island Attorney General and Rhode Island Department of Health are currently evaluating this application, which is now publicly available.
- This meeting is to take public comments on the application of the proposed sale, which will be used by the agencies to inform their ongoing evaluation.
- The agencies will not answer questions or offer comments on the application at this time.
