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## Recommended Guidelines for Outbreak Testing for Nursing Homes and Assisted Living Facilities

- After each positive COVID-19 test is identified, the facility should identify individuals who have been exposed. Test all residents and personnel who are symptomatic or who have had close contact to the positive case. (Click here to view the Interim Infection Prevention and Control Recommendations to Prevent SARS-CoV-2 Spread in Nursing Homes).
  - Facilities can meet the testing requirement through the use of rapid point-of-care (POC) diagnostic testing devices or through an arrangement with an offsite lab.
- 2. Submit specimens of exposed or symptomatic Residents or Staff to your contracted lab (see details below).
  - When using POC tests, provide results via the Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) COVID-19 Reporting Results Portal.
  - When using lab-performed PCR tests, complete your contracted lab's requisition form for each specimen as applicable.
    - RIDOH will automatically receive lab-processed test results ordered by your facility.
    - RIDOH needs the facility to add required case information (such as whether the person was symptomatic, masked, immunocompromised, etc.) to the result via the <u>COVID-19</u> <u>Reporting Results Portal.</u>
- 3. Use of the RIDOH State Health Laboratories (SHL) requires pre-approval from the RIDOH long-term care facilities (LTCF) team. No specimen should be sent to SHL without PRIOR APPROVAL. If approved by the Center for COVID-19 Epidemiology, SHL will be available to assist with sample processing as needed.
  - When approved, and the use of SHL is engaged for outbreak confirmation and case investigation, submit specimens to SHL at:

- Submit in accordance with the specimen submission instructions in the collection kit.
- You will receive a fax or email with the test results if using SHL.
- RIDOH will receive the information automatically and needs the facility to add required case information (such as whether the person was symptomatic, masked, immunocompromised, etc.) to the result via the COVID-19 Reporting Results Portal.
- 4. Response after initial testing results:
  - If test sample results are negative, test individuals again 5 to 7 days from initial date of test.
  - If test sample results are positive, RIDOH's Center for COVID-19 Epidemiology will advise.
    - As directed by RIDOH's Center for COVID-19 Epidemiology, engage in focused or broadbased outbreak testing which includes testing of identified Residents and Staff at least once every 3 to 7 days with POC or PCR tests until there have been no new positives for 14 days.
