The mission of Rhode Island's Health Equity Zone initiative is to build a healthy and resilient Rhode Island by investing in communities and their capacity to affect change; by honoring the expertise of those who live and work in those communities; and by challenging the systems and structures that perpetuate health inequities. HEZ Training and Technical Assistance Program

The HEZ Training and Technical Assistance Program (TTAP) framework supports a variety of learning events, workshops, and convenings to promote collective impact efforts among HEZ collaboratives and other partners. The program also shares practices across the state to advance equity and address the underlying factors that impact health outcomes through engagement and organizing. Learning Community Events

The HEZ Learning Community consists of quarterly conference-style events and is the initiative's primary forum for fostering collective impact and building community capacity. These events are planned and led in partnership with leaders of community-based HEZ collaboratives, bringing together and elevating the expertise of the community and holding space for authentic relationships spanning systems and sectors. For example, a prior event's theme, *Leaning into Difficult Conversations, featured the following sessions: Strategic Framing for Climate Change Communication; Narragansett and Algonquian Homelands Erasure, Reclamation and Recognition; Conflict is a Bridge to Change; and Municipal Government 101: Your Guide to Engaging with Your City or Town.*

Communities of Practice

Following Learning Community events, we found that attendees wanted to focus on and devote time to specific topic areas and build relationships across systems to solve related problems. This led to the formation of HEZ Communities of Practice, including those focused on policy and advocacy, food and environmental justice, and maternal and child health.

Mentorship

The HEZ-to-HEZ sharing of best practices, lessons learned, and institutional knowledge has evolved over time, becoming more formalized through the completion of a HEZ-led, year-long mentorship pilot. In response to recommendations following the pilot and ongoing discussions, a virtual HEZ classroom will provide ongoing, accessible, and robust support allowing for information sharing within and outside of the initiative.
