## NEW (HL7) DATA SUBMITTERS

**Providence Community Health Centers:** Capitol Hill, Central, Chad Brown, Chafee, The Met School, Olneyville, and Prairie Ave. **Hasbro Outpatient Clinics:**

Adolescent Health Center and Coro Specialty Clinics, Hasbro Hospital Primary Care, Medicine Pediatrics, and Hasbro Specialty Clinics.

**Please note:** State-Supplied Vaccine (SSV) providers who are currently in the process of securing HL7 Interface funding, or who are in the HL7 Interface testing phase, must continue submitting KIDSNET Immunization Data Sheets for all patients younger than 19 years of age until transmission is confirmed by HEALTH.

## PEDIARIX RESTRICTION LIFTED

Healthcare providers can once again order Pediarix through the Rhode Island Department of Health (HEALTH)'s State-Supplied Vaccine (SSV) Program. However, healthcare providers are urged to first use their existing inventories of the component vaccines (DTaP, IPV, and Hep B) to prevent these vaccines from expiring and becoming waste.

## MMRV (PROQUAD) AVAILABLE FOR ORDER

ProQuad has once again been made available for providers to order. HEALTH recommends that the vaccine only be ordered for use as the second dose in the MMR and Varicella series due to high rate of febrile seizures for the first dose of the series in pharmaceutical studies.

## SCHOOL IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

School regulations require students to have specific immunizations prior to entering into kindergarten and seventh grade. KIDSNET has added indicators to the immunization program page indicating whether or not those requirements have been met.

**A green check indicates that requirements are met, while a red X indicates some of the requirements have not been met.**

Requirements:

Kindergarten: 

7th Grade: 

To identify what vaccines are needed, move the mouse over the X. The vaccine groups that are not complete will be listed.

### Vaccines for Children Entering Kindergarten

Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B

Five (5) doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis)

Four (4) doses of Polio

Two (2) doses of MMR (measles, mumps, rubella)

Two (2) doses of Varicella (chickenpox) or history of disease

### Vaccines for Children Entering 7th Grade

One (1) dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis)

Four (4) doses of Polio

Two (2) doses of MMR (Measles, mumps, rubella)

Three (3) doses of Hepatitis B

Two (2) doses of Varicella (chickenpox) or history of disease

One (1) dose of Meningococcal conjugate (meningitis)



## NEW INFLUENZA VACCINES – NEW VACCINE CODES

Three Influenza vaccines are available for the 6 month – 18 year old population, including two quadrivalent vaccines. Please make sure your Electronic Health Record (EHR) includes the new vaccine codes or if you are still submitting on paper to KIDSNET, that you are submitting new Data Sheets that include the quadrivalent vaccines.

## VACCINE FOR CHILDREN (VFC) MAXIMUM ADMINISTRATION FEE

The maximum vaccine administration fee that providers may charge for Vaccine for Children (VFC)-eligible children (Medicaid, uninsured, under-insured, and Alaskan Native/American Indian) has increased. The administration maximum fee is now \$22.69 per shot (up from \$14.93 per shot previously).

(highlight and send in patient names who appear on this report and are no longer affiliated with your practice)
- **Lead Screening Report** - Children without a Lead Screening
- **Lead Screening Report** - Children Due for Second Lead Screening
- **Lead Report** - Children with results  $\geq$  5ug/dl (children under 6 years old; result requires a 3 month lead rescreen)
- **School Eligible Report** (checks for school immunization requirements based on age )
- **Immunization Report**
- **Newborn Summary Report**
- **Immunizations Submitted to KIDSNET by Other Providers** (school clinics, travel clinics, urgent walk-ins, etc)

## NEWBORN SCREENING DIAGNOSTIC INFORMATION

All newborns in Rhode Island are screened for 28 conditions before hospital discharge to identify serious or life-threatening conditions before symptoms begin. Early detection, diagnosis, and intervention can prevent death or disability and enable children to reach their full potential. The Rhode Island specialty clinics (e.g., endocrine, metabolic, cystic fibrosis, hemoglobinopathy) will enter newborn diagnoses, test results, and treatment in KIDSNET. Providers will be able to view all newborn screening conditions reported for a particular child.
